Covid-19 breaks logjam over BBMP hospital in Shivajinagar

100-bed facility to open after two years of red tape

A 100-bed super-specialty hospital caught in red tape for two years will soon spring into action thanks to the Covid-19 crisis.

The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) had in 2018 built the hospital on an area of 20,000 sq ft on Broad-

way Road near Russel Market in Shivajinagar at a cost of Rs 40 crore, including the land value.

Because of its inability to run the hospital, the civic body explored various options including leasing it to Narayana Health. After an outcry from civil society members, it was decided that the building will be handed over to Bowring and

Lady Curzon Hospital under the medical education department, which was again stuck in red tape.

The building stood there for two years, with no operations, without ever being formally inaugurated. Now, the government has decided to use it as a hospital exclusively dedicated to Covid-19, and the logjam has finally ended.

Medical Education Minister Dr K Sudhakar told reporters here at a press conference, "The hospital will be handed over to the medical education department tomorrow (Wednesday). It will have 150 beds for Covid-19 patients. Infosys Foundation's Sudha

Murthy has come forward to fund the equipment required for the hospital."

Jawaid Akhtar, Additional Chief Secretary (Health), who is also the secretary for medical education, said the formalities to hand over the hospital to the medical education department are under way. To start with, the hospital will have an isolation ward with 120-150 beds and 20 ventilators.

Asked whether an MoU was signed between the Infosys Foundation and the health department, Akhtar said, "There is no MoU yet. But the agreement is that the hospital will be handed over to her (Sudha Murthy); Infosys Foundation

will take care of equipping the hospital and help the department tide over this crisis. There is no commercial element in this MoU. It was a voluntary gesture from her (Sudha Murthy) foundation."

Vijay S, a public health activist with the Karnataka Janarogya Chaluvali, said the hospital was proposed to be leased to Narayana Health for 30 years. "We had started a petition to stop this. Roshan Baig was representing the constituency then. The idea was finally scrapped. Former chief minister Siddaramaiah was supposed to inaugurate the hospital but it never happened."

Bilal Bagh to downsize even as organisers slapped with FIRs

The city's longest-running protest against the Citizenship Amendment Act moved to downsize on Tuesday, even as several organisers were slapped with FIRs over an alleged case of assault.

This comes in the wake of the protest coming under mounting criticism for its refusal to disband in the wake of the Covid-19 crisis.

The downsizing was seemingly precipitated by a criminal case filed against six people associated with 'Bilal Bagh'.

In a complaint filed with the Kadugondanahalli police on Sunday, Shamsad Begum (56), a resident of HBR Layout,

claimed to have been threatened by the organisers of Bilal Bagh after she asked them not to allow men into the all-women's protest site.

In her hand-written complaint, she wrote that the organisers had turned abusive. "I stopped (talking to them), but they started threatening me and using bad language," she said.

She also alleged that early on Sunday morning, at 2.30 am, the organisers physically attacked her. She claimed that when her husband, Kaleem, came to her defence, he was hit on his right hand by a man she identified as Sadiq.

In all, the Kadugondanahalli police filed FIRs against six in-

dividuals—Ajaz Shariff, Sadiq, Syed Imran, Warsi Shariff (30), Amreen (30) and a man identified only as Amreen's brother.

Sadiq Idrees (25), a Bilal Bagh organiser unconnected with the incident, denied Begum's allegations. "On Sunday, a small group of protesters at the protest site were attacked by a group of petty thugs from the Pillanna Gardens area, who were accompanied by Begum. She was directing the attack," Idrees said.

As late as Monday, organisers sent a press brief, declaring that they would only break up the protest if Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa visited the site.

Inbound international fliers to be quarantined in hotel near KIA

BENGALURU, DHNS: In order to curb the spread of Covid-19, the state government has decided not to let international passengers/tourists enter the city.

The department of health and family welfare will take a hotel near to the Kempegowda International Airport and send international fliers there for home quarantine.

Health Minister B Sriramulu told *DH*: "We are looking for a star hotel near the airport where we can quarantine each and every passenger who flies in from other coun-

tries." *DH* has learnt that irrespective of whether they have the symptoms or not, all inbound international passengers will be quarantined for 14 days at the hotel where the government will take care of their food and other basic needs. "If the passenger doesn't develop any symptoms after 14 days, they will be released from quarantine," the minister added.

The decision was taken as some people flying in from abroad failed to follow the government's instructions of home quarantine.

Iskcon shuts doors over virus

BENGALURU, DHNS: Iskcon, Bengaluru, in the wake of the Covid-19 outbreak, has shut its doors to devotees with effect from today. The closure, until further notice, will not affect the pre-scheduled pujas and sevas, a release from Iskcon stated on Tuesday.

As per the statement, along with the main temple located at the Hare Krishna Hill on West of Chord Road in Rajajinagar, the other Iskcon branches such as Vaitukana Hill near Gubbala on Kanakapura Road will also be shut until further notice.

Palike directs RWAs to keep common areas clean

BENGALURU, DHNS: As the number of Covid-19 cases in the city neared double digit, the BBMP released an advisory to apartments, suggesting that resident welfare associations and societies regulate common areas and ensure strict maintenance of social distance.

The advisory focused on the prevention of people from coming into contact with each other and called for the immediate cancellation of parties and social meetings, besides closing gymnasiums, sporting facilities, swimming pools and recreational and club facilities.

"Common areas, floors, railings and surfaces, likely

to be touched by residents, should be cleaned using sodium hypochlorite, bleaching powder or any effective disinfectant," the advisory, signed by BBMP commissioner B H Anil Kumar said, stressing on the need to give attention to housekeeping staff.

Additionally, the BBMP advised residents to discourage children from playing outside in groups. "Parents are requested to engage children with indoor activities," it said.

"Support and cooperation from your side is highly necessary for the next 30 days and this would reduce the transmission of the infection in the community," the advisory noted.

BBP on high alert in the wake of Covid-19, bird flu

Amid the Covid-19 epidemic, the outbreak of bird flu (H5N1) in Karnataka and neighbouring Kerala has put zoos and biological parks in the state on high alert.

The Bannerghatta Biological Park (BBP), alongside its precautionary measures to contain the spread of Covid-19, is also working overtime to safeguard the fauna in the wake of bird flu outbreak. Guided by the internal health committee, the park has put in place a standard operating procedure (SOP) while handling the food supplied to animals and cleaning of animal and bird enclosures.

Vanashri Vipin Singh, executive director of BBP, told *DH* that the park has already begun a fumigation drive. "The safety of animals as well as visitors is our priority and we have taken several steps since the outbreak of Covid-19 and bird flu. Until we closed for the public, we were spraying sanitiser on visitors entering the park. Besides, they were made to dip their feet in the disinfectant puddle at the entrance so that they do not carry any virus and bacteria inside," Vanashree said.

All the enclosures have also been cleaned and animals are attended to on a daily basis. A few days ago, the cages were disinfected and subjected to heat treatment. "All the bird enclosures at BBP are fully covered and there is no scope for external agents to fly in and infect the birds. Yet, we have been careful about the water and feed. Sampling is done daily and in the wake of bird flu, faecal samples of birds are taken every day and analysed for any possible infection."

Platform ticket to cost Rs 50 at five city railway stations

Hit-and-run kills ex-HAL staffer

BENGALURU, DHNS: A retired employee of HAL was mowed down by a motorcycle in eastern Bengaluru's CV Raman Nagar on Monday night, police said.

Jagadish Nagar Sampath S, 69, and his wife Chitravathi were going for a walk near ADA Gate, BEML Junction, when a motorcycle with no registration number on it hurtled towards them around

9.30 pm. Before Sampath could respond, the motorcyclist knocked him down and rode off. Chitravathi raised an alarm, drawing passersby. They rushed Sampath to a hospital but he succumbed to injuries later.

Jeevan Bima Nagar traffic police have registered a case of hit-and-run and are reviewing the CCTV footage to track down the motorcyclist.

PRR to be delayed as SC raps BDA

It rejected contentions of BDA counsel senior advocate Shyam Divan and advocate Sanjay M Nuli that the effect of fresh clearance would result in gross escalation in the cost from initially estimate of Rs 1,000 crore to Rs 12,000 crore.

The court upheld the National Green Tribunal's order of February 8, 2019 for fresh rapid environmental impact assessment. It directed the BDA to ensure that no potential damage was caused to the petroleum pipelines over which the proposed road would be constructed.

The bench clarified that no other court or tribunal should take up any challenge to the decision of State Expert Appraisal Committee and State Environment Impact Assessment Authority and any grievance can be raised before the top court only.

"Where project proponents and institutions abdicate their duty, it is not only the environment that suffers a serious set-back, but also the development of the nation. The protection of the environment ensures a symbiotic relationship between the development of the nation and the protection of the environment."
